



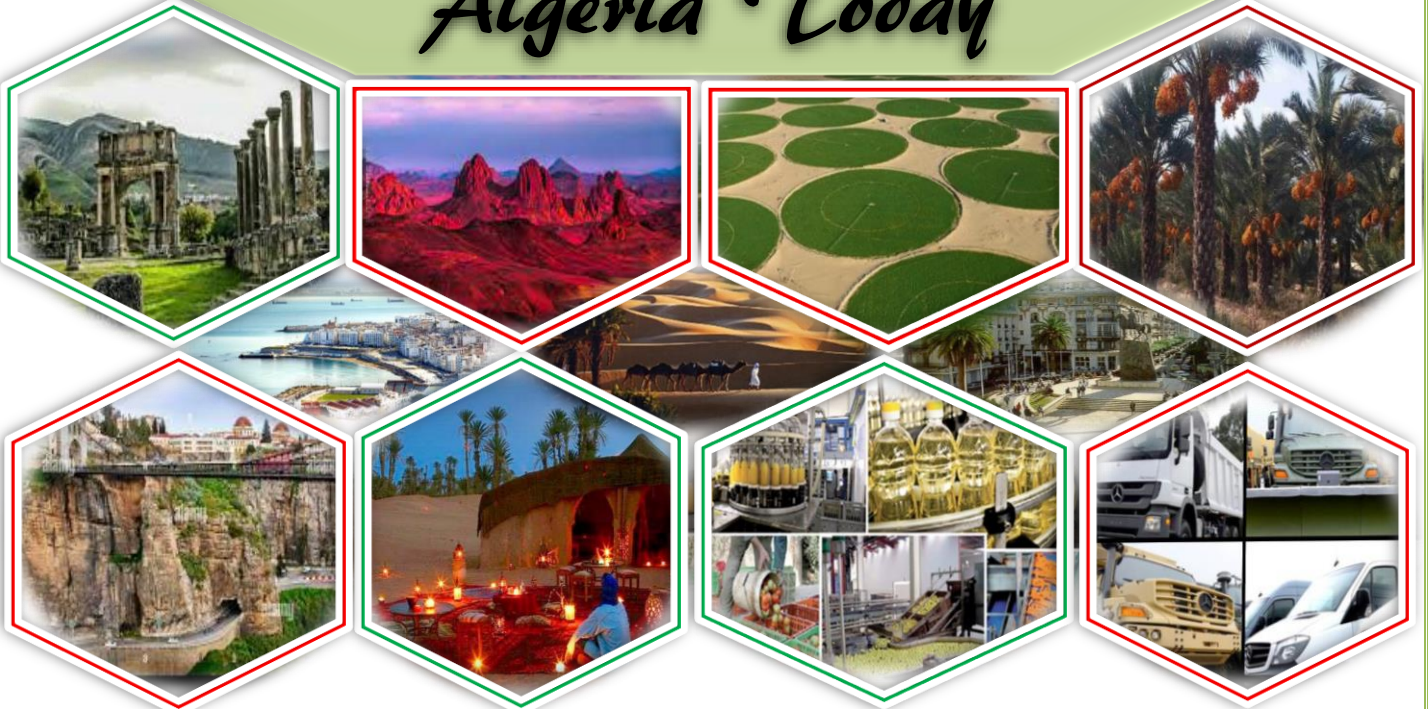

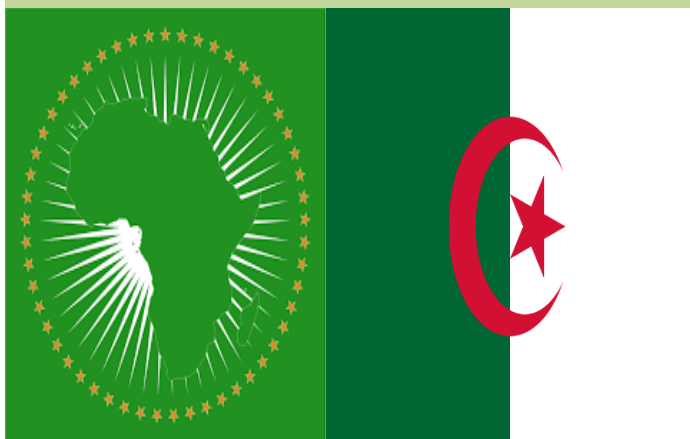
President Tebboune receives Presidents, representatives of Malian political movements



President of the Republic Mr. Abdelmadjid Tebboune received Sunday 26 February 2023, in Algiers, the presidents and representatives of Malian political movements.

We thank President Abdelmadjid Tebboune for this warm welcome and we hail Algeria's role in the peace and reconciliation process in Mali, and also for the establishment of security and peace in the country," said the spokesman of the heads and representatives of the political movements of Mali at the end of the audience. Welcoming the mediation efforts of Algeria for the promotion of dialogue among the signatories of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali, resulting from Algiers process, he said that the meeting enabled underlining Algeria's firm commitments for a "new momentum to peace in the region."

President of the Republic Mr. Abdelmadjid Tebboune decides to grant USD1 billion to fund development projects in Africa



President of the Republic Abdelmadjid Tebboune has decided to allocate USD1 billion to the Algerian Agency of International Cooperation for Solidarity and Development, in order to fund development projects in the African countries.

In a speech read on his behalf by Prime Minister Aïmene Benabderrahmane, during the 36th African Union Heads of State and Government Summit, held in Addis Ababa, the President of the Republic affirmed that this move comes from "Algeria's conviction that the security and stability in Africa are linked to development."

"I have decided to inject one billion dollars into the Algerian Agency of International Cooperation for Solidarity and Development to fund development projects in the African countries, notably the projects of integration or those contributing to the acceleration of development in Africa," said President Tebboune.

The Agency will start the procedures for the implementations of this strategic initiative in coordination with the African countries that want to benefit from it.

Foreign Policy

General Chanegriha receives Secretary of Russian Security Council



General Said Chanegriha, the Chief of Staff of the People's National Army, received Monday 27 February 2023, the Secretary of the Russian Federation Security Council Nikolai Patrouchev who was on a visit to Algeria leading a large delegation.

During this audience, the two sides discussed "the state of the military cooperation between the two countries' armies and ways to strengthen it and exchanges views on the different issues of common interest,".

On this occasion, General Chanegriha underlined that "The efforts made by Algeria and Russia to contribute to the establishment of sustainable peace and development, in respect of the States' sovereignty, are consistent with the unchanging and historical principles that contributed to the development of close bilateral cooperation relations, based on mutual trust and the common interests of the two countries".

General Said Chanegriha receives AFRICOM Commander



The Chief of Staff of the People's National Army, General Said Chanegriha, received in an audience on Wednesday 8 February 2023 at the headquarters of the General Staff of the People's National Army the Commander of US Africa Command "AFRICOM" General Michael Langley, leading a large military delegation.

During this meeting, the two sides discussed "the security challenges facing the African continent, exchanged viewpoints on issues of common interest and examined ways enabling the strengthening of the military cooperation relations between the two countries."

In this regard, the General Said Chanegriha delivered a speech, at the end of which he welcomed the guest delegation, underlining that this visit "is an opportunity for the two sides to reaffirm their commitment to extend together the fields of the bilateral military cooperation."

"We can seize this opportunity together to reaffirm our commitment to expanding the fields of our military cooperation and to discuss, pragmatically and objectively, issues of common interest in the region," said General Said Chanegriha, pointing out that "the security context on the international scene is marked by the emergence of armed conflicts and exacerbation of crises and tensions."

General Saïd Chanegriha, the Chief of Staff of the People's National Army, received Sunday 26 February 2023, at the army headquarters, James Stephen Heapey, UK's minister of State for the Armed Forces, who was on a visit to Algeria leading a large delegation. During the audience, the two sides discussed "the state of the military cooperation between the armies of the two countries and the ways to strengthen them," in addition to "global security challenges in general, and in Africa in particular.

The two sides also exchanged views on the "different issues of common interest," the statement said. General Chanegriha made an address in which he welcomed the UK official and his delegation, saying that the UK delegation's visit to Algeria was "in continuity with the previous visits that have allowed the two sides to discuss topical issues and issues of common interest."

Algeria has adopted interactive policy to support counterterrorism efforts in Sahel



The Speaker of the People's National Assembly (Lower House), Mr. Brahim Boughali said Sunday 26 February 2023 at the opening of the 2nd meeting of "The Sahel Call" series of meetings held in Algiers, on The Role of Local Leaders in the Fight against Terrorism and Prevention against Violent Extremism, that Algeria had adopted an interactive and integrated policy to support efforts to fight terrorism and violent extremism in the Sahel region.

He emphasized "the intensification by Algeria of regional operational cooperation through the Joint Operational Staff Committee (JOSC) and the coordination and communication unit, in addition to contributing to the treatment of the root causes of this dangerous scourge by boosting development efforts." Mr. Boughali stated that "Algeria is working to achieve the structuring projects to inclusive nature, an approach affirmed by the strategic direction expressed by the President of the Republic Abdelmadjid Tebboune, who allotted a billion dollars to support development in African states through the Algerian Agency for International Cooperation for Solidarity and Development."

"The worrying trend of international relations in recent years, even in recent months, requires more caution to meet these multifaceted challenges facing the Sahel region, which should in no case become an arena of conflict threatening its security and stability" he argued.

In this regard, he said that "Algeria attaches particular importance to the development and improvement of regional and international mechanisms to combat terrorism and violent extremism, through the African Union (AU) or via the Global Counter-Terrorism Forum (GCTF), in which Algeria co-chairs the working group to strengthen national capacities of West African countries."

The Prime Minister, attended "Dakar Financing Summit for Africa's Infrastructure"



The Prime Minister, Aimene Benabderrahmane arrived on Wednesday 1 February 2023 in the capital of Senegal to participate, in the official opening of the second "Dakar Financing Summit for Africa's Infrastructure."

The Prime Minister had talks with his Senegalese counterpart. During this meeting, the two parties discussed the status and prospects of bilateral relations and ways to boost the mechanisms of bilateral cooperation and partnership in all areas.

During the summit, the Prime Minister said that Algeria had spared no effort, since independence, to achieve African integration, adding that it put today its experience to the benefit of African countries through development projects allowing the continent to reach the highest levels of development.

To achieve complementarity among African countries, "Algeria had always given priority to integration and to the continental dimension in its projects," Mr. Benabderrahmane said.

Algeria "was one of the first countries to write off the debts of 14 African countries, through a sum of 1.4 billion dollars, allowing those countries to get rid of indebtedness that was hindering their development process."

"Algeria put its experience to the benefit of African countries to carry out development projects in terms of human resources training and the selection of the most effective development models."

AU Summit: Approach unifying Africa, making its voice heard



In an address, on the sidelines of the 36th AU Summit of Heads of State and Government, the Prime Minister, Aymen Benabderrahmane, said Sunday 18 February 2023, in Addis Ababa, that African leaders are working for the establishment of an approach to unify Africa and make its voice heard on the international stage regarding global problems, mainly those having a direct impact on the continent's countries.

"African leaders are working for the unification of the African voice so that the continent's problems are settled by the Africans," and "for its points of view to be heard concerning the problems facing the world, especially those with a direct impact on the continent."

Those global problems, impacting supply chains and raw materials, "have significant repercussions on the budgets of African countries suffering from the debt crisis, the main obstacle to real development today. Algeria, which has no foreign debts but has mechanisms to achieve a greater balance, is ready to help the African brothers," the Prime Minister said.

The African Summit "is an opportunity to set out Algeria's vision on the activation of peace and security mechanisms to achieve stability for the continent's countries."

In his address he insisted on the African strategy of the fight against climate change in anticipation of the next international events, "far from any value judgment on the success or not of the COP-27, we must understand the strategic transformation that the developed countries aspired to, namely the restructuring of the international framework of the climate action far from the Rio Principles guaranteeing to the emerging countries their right to development."

Lamamra discusses, in Addis Ababa, with several European, Australian officials



Minister of Foreign Affairs and National community Abroad Ramtane Lamamra held on Saturday 18 February 2023, in Addis Ababa, discussions with officials from Europe and Australia as part of his participation in the African Union Summit.

Mr. Lamamra had meetings with Portuguese Prime Minister Antonio Costa, President of the European Council Mr. Charles Michel and Australian Assistant Minister for Foreign Affairs Mr. Tim Watts.

Mr. Lamamra examined with Portugal's Prime Minister the Algerian-Portuguese relations and their promising prospects. Mr. Costa affirmed that "he aspires to participate personally in the next events between the two countries bound by the Treaty of Friendship, Good Neighborliness and Cooperation since 2005."

With the President of the European Council Charles Michel, Lamamra discussed "the issues related to the partnership between Algeria and the European Union (EU) as well as ways to strengthen it in accordance with the principle of the balance of interests."

The Minister agreed with Australian Assistant Minister for Foreign Affairs Tim Watts to "to support each other for the candidacy of the two countries in international organizations to which they belong and exchange views on the situation prevailing in the Sahel-Saharan region."

Algeria-Russia: Lavrov praises historical relations, strategic partnership



Russian Foreign Serguei Lavrov praised the "excellent historical relations" between Russia and Algeria, highlighting the importance of the strategic partnership and active dialogue between the two sides in all fields.

In an interview to RT Arabic on Thursday 2 February 2023, Lavrov stressed the "historical relations between the two countries" and the "respect between the two peoples," noting his country's support to Algeria during the National Liberation war against French colonisation.

The head of Russian diplomacy said the relations between his country and Algeria dated back before Algeria independence (1962).

"We have had, since then, a close relationship in all fields with an intensive political dialogue."

Lavrov cited the phone conversations between President of the Republic Abdelmadjid Tebboune and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin, adding that "President Tebboune understands the meaning, the history and the future of the Algerian-Russian strategic partnership."

Algeria, he added, was the first African country to sign a Strategic Partnership Declaration with Russia in 2001, dubbing the agreement a "basis for our relations that gives a specific nature to our contacts."

With respect to bilateral political contacts, Lavrov recalled his meeting with his Algerian counterpart, Ramtane Lamamra, on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly session last September, and last years' events that "have shown the solid platform on which is based the political cooperation between the

Resolution of conflicts: US Deputy Secretary of State expresses gratitude for Algeria's contributions



US Deputy Secretary of State Wendy R. Sherman on Wednesday 1 February 2023, expressed gratitude for Algeria's contributions to the resolution of regional conflicts, in a phone call with the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the National Community Abroad, Mr. Ramtane Lamamra.

Sherman "expressed gratitude for Algeria's contributions to the resolution of regional conflicts, including Algeria's support for urgent de-escalation of violence" in occupied Palestine and "for UN efforts to advance an enduring and dignified resolution for Western Sahara (conflict), and for improving security in the Sahel," the US Department of State spokesman Ned Price said in a statement.

Lamamra had a phone discussion with Wendy Sherman at the initiative of the US official, according to a statement by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The two officials exchanged views on various regional and international issues of common interest, including the situation in Mali and the Sahel region, international cooperation in counterterrorism, Western Sahara and Palestine issues, as well as the current crisis in international relations against the backdrop of the conflict in Ukraine.

Minister Lamamra on working visit to South Africa



Minister of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad Ramtane Lamamra paid on Monday 13 February 2023 a working visit to Pretoria, as part of the periodic political consultations between Algeria and South Africa and in anticipation of the next bilateral events.

On this occasion, the Minister had one-on-one discussions with his South African counterpart, broadened then to the delegations which stressed the historical and privileged relations between the two countries and peoples as well as the two countries' and willingness to strengthen their strategic character as part of the completion of the preparations for the 7th High Joint Committee which will be held in Algeria under the chairmanship of the two heads of State.

The two sides discussed issues of common interest at the continental and international levels, notably the current crisis in the international relations against a background of the conflict in Ukraine, the decolonization of Palestine and Western Sahara as well as the security and peace situation in Africa in the light of the objectives of the Agenda 2063 of the African Union (AU).

Mr. Lamamra takes part in 32nd Summit of African Peer Review Mechanism



Minister of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad, Mr. Ramtane Lamamra, took part on Thursday 9 February 2023 in the 32nd Summit of African Peer Review Mechanism whose works were held by videoconference, the Ministry said in a statement.

In his speech, Mr. Lamamra emphasized Algeria's commitment to the objectives of the African architecture of Governance, underscoring its contribution to the promotion of the stability, development and the well-being of the African peoples.

In this regard, the Minister said that the African Peer Review Mechanism, which celebrates this year the 20th anniversary of its launch, has recorded many successes predisposing it to assume a key role in the implementation of the 2063 continental agenda.

Algeria's moves to enshrine peace, reconciliation process in Mali continue



Minister of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad Ramtane Lamamra affirmed that Algeria continues its moves to reach necessary consensus between all the Malian parties signatories to the Agreement on peace and reconciliation in Mali, stemming from Algiers process and to strengthen their adherence to this framework, in order to achieve its goals in the field.

As part of his participation in the 41 AU Executive Council, Lamamra held on Thursday 16 February 2023, in Addis Ababa, bilateral discussions with his Malian counterpart Abdoulaye Diop as well as with the President of the Commission of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) Mr. Omar Touray.

The talks focused mainly on the challenges facing the peace and reconciliation process in Mali, as well as ways that help overcome current hindrances in order to boost the implementation of the Agreement on peace and reconciliation in Mali, stemming from Algiers process.

In his capacity as the leader of the international mediation and president of the follow-up Committee for the implementation of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali, Algeria continues its moves to reach the necessary consensus between all the Malian parties signatories to the Agreement and to strengthen their adherence to this framework, in order to achieve its goals in the field, said Mr. Lamamra.

Algerian-Austrian political consultations: Joint willingness to promote bilateral cooperation



The Algerian-Austrian political consultations were held on 7 February 2023 in Vienna under the co-chairmanship of Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad Mr. Amar Belani, and Secretary General of Austria's Ministry for European and International Affairs Mr. Peter Launsky-Tiffenthal.

This session of political consultations enabled the two sides to "discuss the state of the relations and exchange views on international and regional issues of common interest".

At the bilateral level, it was agreed to "promote the cooperation in various fields of activity, notably those of transport, agriculture and vocational training, as well as the Austrian direct investments in Algeria, in order to raise it up to the level of the excellent political relations which have always existed between the two countries and their respective potentials, at a time when they are celebrating the 60th anniversary of the establishment of their diplomatic relations,".

As regards the international issues, the two sides, which exchanged views on the latest developments of the crises, notably those relating to their direct neighborhood (Ukraine, Western Sahara, Mali, Libya, Sahel, Middle East), " stressed the necessity of privileging the peaceful settlement of the disagreements and abiding by the international law, and discussed the challenges related to the fight against terrorism, disarmament and the migration issues,".

Mr. Belani has also talks with the Foreign and European Policy Adviser to the Federal Chancellor of the Republic of Austria Barbara Kaudel-Jensen with whom he exchanged views on the ways to consolidate and diversify the bilateral cooperation..

3rd Algerian-Croatian political consultations in Algiers



The third Algerian-Croatian Political Consultations, chaired by the Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad, Mr. Amar Belani, holed Tuesday 21 February 2023 in Algiers, in the presence of the Croatian delegation led by the Secretary of State to Political Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs, M. Frano Matusic.

At the opening of the works, Mr. Belani said the meeting was one of the mechanisms of bilateral cooperation between Algeria and Croatia, through which "we want to deepen bilateral political dialogue and expand cooperation in the economic and cultural fields, to raise them to the level of the expectations and aspirations of the two countries and two peoples."

The Secretary General said that the cooperation between the two countries, in priority strategic areas, such as agriculture, industry, tourism, startups, sport, shipbuilding and energy." He added that all goals met throughout the year "will enhance the momentum characterizing our bilateral relations, and will be an opportunity to show our common desire to raise our relations to a higher level for a more diversified partnership, direct investments and mutual win-win."

Mr. Frano Matusic said he was delighted with the celebration of the 31st anniversary of Algerian-Croatian friendship relations. The Croatian official stressed the intensity of bilateral cooperation and the natural belonging to the Mediterranean.

2nd Algerian-Venezuelan political consultations in Algiers



The Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad Mr. Amar Belani co-chaired on Thursday 2 February 2023 in Algiers with Venezuela's Deputy Minister of the Department of International Relations, in charge of Africa, Mr. Yuri Alexandre Pimentel Moura, the second session of the Algerian-Venezuelan political consultations.

This session, which comes after the official visit paid to Algeria, in June 2022, by Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro Moros, was an opportunity for the two officials to examine the state of the bilateral cooperation and ways to promote it in various fields, as well as to exchange views on regional and international issues of common interest.

At the bilateral level, the two sides, reaffirmed their common willingness to work for their revitalization, notably in the energetic, agricultural, scientific, academic, educational, touristic and cultural fields as well as in air transport, economic exchanges, and exploration of trade opportunities.”

In this respect, the two sides reiterated, in accordance with the instructions of the two countries' presidents, their willingness to sign the draft aviation agreement which enabled the opening of a direct air link between the two capitals, in order to promote trade between the two countries and underline the importance of promoting the exchange of bilateral commercial and economic visits to establish a working relationship between the Trade Chambers of the two countries.

At the regional and international levels, the two sides welcomed the convergence of their views on a number of issues such as the situation in Mali and Sahel, the Sahrawi issue, the crisis in Libya, the Palestinian cause and the regional and sub-regional integration process.

As regard the situation in Western Sahara, the two sides, after examining the latest developments, “reaffirmed their support to the inalienable right of the Sahrawi people to self-determination, through the organization of a free and fair referendum, in accordance with the relevant United Nations resolutions and its doctrine in terms of decolonization.”.

UNICEF Executive Board unanimously adopts cooperation programme with Algeria for 2023-2027



The UNICEF Executive Board unanimously adopted on Wednesday 10 February 2023, in New York, the cooperation programme with Algeria for the period 2023-2027, which will contribute to supporting the efforts made by Algeria to achieve the sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), notably in the fields of education, capacity building, first aid and social welfare.

The programme will contribute to supporting the efforts made by Algeria in order to achieve sustainable development, notably in the sectors of education, skills training, primary health care and social welfare.

Algeria's embassy in Kyiv to reopen soon



The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad has decided to reopen Algeria's embassy in Kyiv (Ukraine) "as soon as possible".

This decision is part of the preservation of the interests of the Algerian state in this country and those of the national community.

According to the Ministry, "Algeria's Embassy in Kyiv, whose activities have been frozen due to the deterioration of security conditions in this country, will be headed by a chargé d'affaires.

This decision will take effect as soon as possible.

Tindouf: opening of the 8th edition of the Maoussim Jaken El-Abar



The 8th edition of the "Maoussim Jaken El-Abar", culture and heritage event was held on Saturday 25 February 2023 in Tindouf. The opening ceremony of this cultural event was marked by fantasia shows accompanied by salvos of baroud, presented by folklore group from different regions of the country. The participants in this annual event have indicated that "Maoussim Jaken El-Abar" has become an important event which is added to the various cultural events that this wilaya hosts.

The president of the "Jaken El-Abar" association, Abdeldjalil Tahar, said that this event is an added value for the region, as it provides a meeting place for all components of society to show the cultural diversity reflecting the authenticity of the Algerian people. He added: "Maoussim Jaken El-Abar" has also become an unending tradition, given its contribution to bringing together participants from the same tribe spread over different regions. The event is also considered an effective and important tool for maintaining strong ties between the Algerian people and their brothers in neighbouring countries.

In his opening speech, the head of the local executive, Mohamed Mokhbi said that this event has a cultural and religious dimensions, especially given the activities organized on the occasion to enhance the local heritage, such as folklore shows, exhibitions of manuscripts, in addition to the organization of meetings and conferences. As part of this cultural event, a meeting on "the role of zaouias in the implementation of cultural tourism" was scheduled at the Ali Kafi University Centre in Tindouf, according to the organisers. The meeting was led by professors and researchers from various universities across the country and others from the Sahel countries.



Algerian traditional music: 11 classification files submitted to UNESCO



The Director of the National Centre for Prehistoric, Anthropological and Historical Research (CNRPAH), Mr. Slimane Hachi, announced on Wednesday 22 February 2023 in Tlemcen that eleven files will be submitted to UNESCO with a view to the classification of various Algerian musical genres as universal heritage.

These files concern the female songs "Sraoui" and "Acewiq" from the Kabylie region, "Ayay" from the wilayas of Laghouat and Biskra, the Châabi El Assimi, El Malouf, El Hawzi, El Haoufi and other musical genres, Mr. Hachi said.

The Director of CNRPAH added that committees composed of specialists and researchers are in charge of these files relating to these musical genres which will be progressively submitted to UNESCO.

It is also planned, at the end of next March, to submit the file on the traditional female costume of the eastern region of the country which includes "Melahfa", the "gandoura" and other outfits with a view to their classification as world heritage, the same official added.

UNESCO had previously classified as world heritage the Chedda Tlemcenienne wedding costume, the Couscous, the Raï song, the celebration of Sbiba, "Seboua" of Timimoune, the traditional song "Ahli" of Gurara, the procession of the Ouled Sidi Cheikh and the traditional irrigation and water distribution system "Fougara", it was recalled.

Algerian Amina Bettiche wins Castellon Marathon 2023

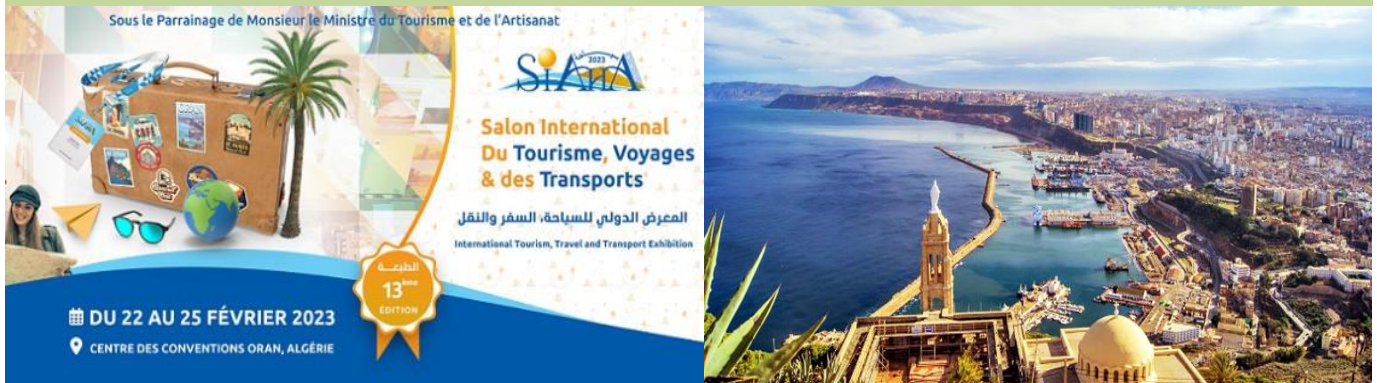

13th SIAHA tourism show in Oran



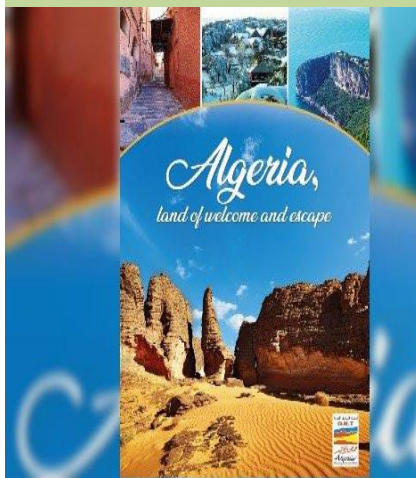

Alone, adventuring in the paved maze of this Mediterranean city par excellence, or accompanied by local guides or residents, they all stopped by the museums of the Kasbah to discover the architecture of the Mustapha-Pacha or Dar Khedaoudj palaces and the history of the infamous residence of 5, rue des Abdérames, now the Ali-La-Pointe Museum. The local architecture, the ornaments and constructions of the Ottoman period, the fortifications and patio houses and the secular mosques are always highlighted in the content of the visitors of this inhabited historical site classified as a cultural heritage of humanity by UNESCO in 1992. The visitors of the Kasbah also seek to unearth the rare pearl, the good plan or the discovery at the craftsmen, the tradesmen and the restaurant owners who compete of originality and show an unparalleled hospitality largely greeted by all the visitors, pleasantly surprised to be able to lunch on a terrace of house with Bab Jdid or Sidi Ramdane vis-a-vis a sight on the bay of Algiers.
